SNHU IN THE HIGH SCHOOL – Fall 2017

SNHU in the High School is a dual enrollment program between Southern New Hampshire University and various high schools. The program allows qualified high school students (sophomores, juniors or seniors) the opportunity to earn **early college credit** while still in high school. Students who enroll and successfully complete courses being offered at Bow High School are entitled to receive three (3) University credits per course.
